The city of Reykjavik will for the fourth time welcome sports participants to a multisport competition in Laugardalur, the Valley of Sport, taking place the 3rd weekend in January 2011.

Athletes will compete at a high level in various sports in world class facilities. Opening and closing ceremonies among other things will keep the athletes happy and entertained and they will also have the opportunity to visit Reykjavik, the Capital of Iceland with all its sights and sounds. If lucky you might also see the northern lights.

Registration / Entries

The competition is open to all countries.

All entries must be made through the fencer's national federation via the EFC website before January 8th 2011. As per the 2010-2011 EFC regulations, not more than 20 entries per country can be accepted apart from the host nation where a maximum of 64 are allowed.

Entry fee: €15 per fencer for the individual and €20 per team to be paid at check-in.

Competition format

- Two rounds of pools of 6-7 fencers, at least 20% eliminated after each round
- Direct elimination with "repechage" starting from Tableau 32
- Finals without fence-off for 3rd place

EFC regulations will apply throughout the competition.

Referees (according with EFC rules):

- 1-4 fencers, no referee required
- 5-9 fencers, 1 referee
- 10-15 fencers, 2 referees
- 16-20 fencers, 3 referees

Non respect of quota is sanctioned by 300 EUR for every missing referee per competition.

Accommodation

We intend this visit to be both educational and entertaining for the young fencers from your country and we would like to offer a free accommodation for 2 boys and 2 girls per country.

Reykjavik offers a wide variety of accommodation, from youth hostels to luxury hotels and many of them are conveniently located around Laugardalur. In fact all the main hotels and guesthouses are well situated within the city, providing easy access both to the downtown area and the venues of the 2010 Reykjavik International Games.
